Face to Face: Adolescent mental health and self-harm:

Course description:

Participants will learn about adolescent development and the signs and symptoms of mental health problems, where and how to get help and what sort of help has been shown by research to be effective.

Course objectives:

- An overview of the latest research on the extent of self-harm among young people and the particular groups at highest risk
- An understanding of why young people self-harm and key steps to help young people reduce their harming
- An understanding of physical and emotional indicators of self-harm and suicide
- Learn clear and practical information on how to explore suicide and respond appropriately.
- Insight into the realities for the first generation of teenagers using technology as a primary means of socialising and communicating.
- Show how to lead constructive self-talk.
- Where to refer young people to specialist support and an introduction to the resources that are available.

Course description: This event offers an opportunity for senior staff at all levels to refresh and update their knowledge about safeguarding and child protection in line with the expectations in "Working Together".

Course objectives:

Participants will have:

- Refreshed and updated their safeguarding and child protection knowledge
- Considered some of the current issues that present dilemmas for their staff in safeguarding and protecting children and young people
- Gained an understanding of how the learning needs of staff at all levels are addressed in multi-agency training

Course description: This event is for multi-agency practitioners who have completed safeguarding basic awareness training and need to increase their knowledge about emotional abuse and neglect and how it can impact children and young people.

Course objectives:

Participants will have:

- Considered how parents/carers can understand how to provide for their children in a way that meets their need for safety and protection
- Gained an understanding of how children and young people are affected when they
 are emotionally abused and/or neglected
- Explored strategies to support children, young people and their families where emotional abuse and/or neglect is a concern
- Developed an awareness of current thinking and research and how to keep up to date with changes in practice in this area

Face to Face: Thinking the unthinkable: Multiagency responses to working with Child Sexual abuse

Course description: This one-day event will examine national and local prevalence of child sexual abuse. Offering practical guidance, the course will support you to develop best practice in recognising and responding to children who have been sexually abused.

Course objectives:

- To look at the national and local learning from practice reviews into child sexual abuse.
- Understanding prevalence and research.
- To inform practitioners around identifying signs and indicators of child sexual abuse and understanding the barriers to children disclosing abuse.
- Examining the investigation process and Camden's Multi-Agency Response Pathways to child sexual abuse: Prevent, identify, support, disrupt and enforce.
- How to respond to disclosures and understanding language, stages of development, stigma and shame.
- Multidisciplinary network support in the child's and carers recovery from trauma
- To understand the Lighthouse multidisciplinary recovery service in Camden. Collaboration with the Lighthouse Multidisciplinary recovery service to support best outcomes for Camden children.

Course description: This one-day programme will provide you with the essential skills and knowledge to be effective as a Designated Safeguarding Lead.

Course objectives:

By the end of the course you will have:

- Developed your understanding of the role and responsibilities of the Designated Safeguarding Lead
- Gained a practical understanding of relevant law and statutory guidance
- Used case scenarios to develop your ability to judge when to consult with, or refer to, Children's Social Care, and
- Considered some of the key issues in working effectively with other agencies, in particular colleagues in Children's Social Care, Health and Police

The training is highly participative, and you are encouraged to bring questions and examples from your own professional practice. It will be informed throughout by relevant law, guidance, procedures, theory, child safeguarding practice reviews (formerly serious case reviews), current research and will be supported by a comprehensive handout pack.

Target Audience: This session is for new Designated Safeguarding Leads, who have not received training in this area previously.

Course objectives:

- Increase awareness of tending substance misuse affecting young people
- Increase knowledge of spotting the signs of the physical and emotional risk associated with trending substances
- Learn how to assess and respond to reduce immediate risk when a young person presents under the influence of substances
- Increase knowledge on Naloxone kit and how to administer it
- Increase awareness around hidden harms
- Increase knowledge and confidence to make an appropriate onward referral

Virtual: Building effective relationships with families:

Course description: Many families have some concerns and reservations, at least initially, to being worked with by children's professionals. Parents who are worked with in a safeguarding process will often have histories that include disadvantage and discrimination, and may experience professional contact as a further sign that they have 'failed' in their parenting. The aim of this one-day programme is to support you in developing your skills in building effective relationships with parents and offer some practical techniques to improve the likelihood of engaging constructively with them.

Course objectives: By the end of the programme you will have:

- Developed your awareness of the signs a parent may need greater effort to build a positive relationship with, and some of the possible reasons why this might be needed
- Looked at the key role professionals have in building positive collaborative relationships with families, while understanding the appropriate use of professional authority when there are child protection concerns
- Considered signs that can indicate a parent's degree of commitment to, and confidence in, making changes
- Been introduced to frameworks for making sense of the change process, and
- Identified actions that professionals can take to motivate, support and encourage parents to engage with plans to safeguard and promote their children's welfare.

Virtual: Safeguarding LGBTQ+ children and young people

Course Description: This training promotes understanding, inclusivity, and sensitivity which is crucial in creating a more respectful and supportive environment for LGBTQ+ children and young people. Tracy will provide a safe space for open discussion and encourage participants to ask sensitive questions. She fosters an environment where individuals can learn and gain a deeper understanding of LGBTQ+ issues without fear of judgment.

Course Objectives:

The day will consist of four modules:

- 1. Breaking the binary
- 2. Removing the barriers
- 3. The things you need to know for early support of trans and non-binary children and young people
- 4. The things you need to know for continued support of trans and non-binary children and young people

Target Audience: This event is suitable for professionals in all Working Together Groups and meets the requirements of Level 3 of the Intercollegiate Document.

The Camden Safeguarding Children Partnership provides safeguarding training **free of charge** to all agencies working directly with children and young people in Camden. The Partnership expects that all delegates offered a place at the course attend. If delegates cannot attend, the Partnership or training providers need to be notified 7 days in advance in order for the place to be filled by another professional.

Failure to attend the training may result in a £125 non-attendance fee being charged to your agency.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Where can I find information about the multi-agency training programme?

How do I apply to attend courses?

Once you have opened a training account you need to visit the website https://cscp.org.uk/training/calendar-of-events/ and click on the course of your choice, you can then click 'Apply'. You will then receive an email if your application is successful.

You cannot apply for a place on a course unless you have registered with us first. You cannot apply for a place on a course on behalf of somebody else.

How much does the training cost and what are the cancellation arrangements?

CSCP multi-agency courses are funded by the agencies which make up the Partnership. There is no charge for individuals attending CSCP training. Please note that if you are offered a place on a course and do not explain non-attendance or you cancel less than one week before the event your agency will be charged a £125 non-attendance fee. We expect that you will have discussed your application and how it meets your training needs before applying and that your manager will facilitate your attendance. If you need to cancel your place – you must do this via the website.

If I can't come can I give my place to someone else from my agency?

It may be possible to arrange this, but please ask us before proceeding as in some circumstances we will need to offer to those on the waiting list.

Will delegates receive certificates on multi-agency courses?

Participants will be provided with certificates of attendance if they attend the whole course. Arriving late or leaving early may result in not receiving a certificate. All certificates will be shared within 6-8 weeks of the course.
