## Face-to-face: Trauma-informed and relationship-based Practice

**Course description:** The programme will bring to participants the most up-to-date research and practice wisdom. They will be offered opportunities to reflect on the materials as well as to try out ideas in a safe space, to develop practice.

**Course objectives:** This trauma-informed practice in Camden (TIPiC) training will give an overview of how trauma-informed practice (TIP) underpins our work with vulnerable children and their families. TIP is an approach that helps professionals and services to work with all children in ways that minimise the impact of traumatic childhood experiences on social, emotional development, and thinking and problem-solving abilities (cognitive development).

This training will aim to develop staff skills to:

- Understand what children and young people may be communicating through their behaviour, rather than simply responding to it.
- Understand and identify the underlying needs of children and young people, and use evidence-based strategies to meet needs, including relationship-based practices.
- Reflect on effective organisational responses for those who have experienced trauma, including how organisations can support staff to enhance their resilience.

Attendees will be offered opportunities to reflect on the materials as well as to discuss ideas in a safe space.

**Course description:** This one-day programme will provide you with the essential skills and knowledge to be effective as a Designated Safeguarding Lead.

### **Course objectives:**

By the end of the course you will have:

- Developed your understanding of the role and responsibilities of the Designated Safeguarding Lead
- Gained a practical understanding of relevant law and statutory guidance
- Used case scenarios to develop your ability to judge when to consult with, or refer to, Children's Social Care, and
- Considered some of the key issues in working effectively with other agencies, in particular colleagues in Children's Social Care, Health and Police

The training is highly participative, and you are encouraged to bring questions and examples from your own professional practice. It will be informed throughout by relevant law, guidance, procedures, theory, child safeguarding practice reviews (formerly serious case reviews), current research and will be supported by a comprehensive handout pack.

**Target Audience:** This session is for new Designated Safeguarding Leads, who have not received training in this area previously.

## Face to Face: Thinking the unthinkable: Multiagency responses to working with Child Sexual abuse

**Course description:** This one-day event will examine national and local prevalence of child sexual abuse. Offering practical guidance, the course will support you to develop best practice in recognising and responding to children who have been sexually abused.

### Course objectives:

- To look at the national and local learning from practice reviews into child sexual abuse.
- Understanding prevalence and research.
- To inform practitioners around identifying signs and indicators of child sexual abuse and understanding the barriers to children disclosing abuse.
- Examining the investigation process and Camden's Multi-Agency Response Pathways to child sexual abuse: Prevent, identify, support, disrupt and enforce.
- How to respond to disclosures and understanding language, stages of development, stigma and shame.
- Multidisciplinary network support in the child's and carers recovery from trauma
- To understand the Lighthouse multidisciplinary recovery service in Camden. Collaboration with the Lighthouse Multidisciplinary recovery service to support best outcomes for Camden children.

## Face to Face: Safeguarding against radicalisation

**Course description:** This training explains Prevent (the Government's counter-terrorism strategy), the radicalisation process, how to identify people who may be at-risk of radicalisation, how to raise concerns and appropriate safeguarding responses.

WRAP training is aimed at increasing your understanding, knowledge, and awareness in issues relating to radicalisation and extremism while helping professionals counter extremist narratives.

### **Course objectives:**

Participants will gain:

- An understanding of understand what radicalisation means and why people may be vulnerable to being drawn into terrorism as a consequence of it.
- An awareness of what we mean by the term “extremism” and the relationship between extremism and terrorism
- The ability to use existing expertise and professional judgment to recognise potential vulnerable individuals and know when an intervention may be necessary to support them
- Knowledge of how to obtain support for people who may be being exploited by radicalising influences

**Target Audience:** Anyone working with individuals that are vulnerable to radicalisation including: Youth workers, Social workers, Teachers, Early Years. This event is suitable for professionals in all Working Together Groups.

**Face to Face: SP-EAK Suicide Prevention – Explore, Ask, Keep-Safe**  
**Training to develop suicide prevention skills**

**Course description:** This programme provides participants with an introduction to suicide prevention skills, drawing on the most up-to-date research and practice from POPYRUS. It offers a safe and supportive space to explore attitudes, myths and stigma surrounding suicide, reflect on real-life scenarios, and practise having open, sensitive conversations with someone who may be experiencing suicidal thoughts. Attendees will also be introduced to the process of creating an initial safety plan to help keep a person safe from suicide

**Course objectives:** By the end of the programme attendees will have and understanding of:

- Consider attitudes, myths and stigma that surround suicide
- Recognise and explore 'signs' that may indicate someone is having thoughts of suicide
- Encourage an open, safe and sensitive conversation about suicide with a person who may be struggling
- Support the development of a safety plan with someone thinking about suicide, helping them identify immediate steps and sources of support.

**Target Audience:** This course is suitable for all professionals working with children, young people, families or the wider community, including anyone within multi-agency Working Together groups who may need to support individuals experiencing emotional distress or suicidal thoughts

## Face to face: Safer Recruitment for the Children's workforce/EY Settings

<b>Course description:</b> <p>This two-part programme equips practitioners with the key knowledge and practical skills needed for safer recruitment across children's services and Early Years settings. Across two half-day sessions, participants will learn how to apply safer recruitment principles at every stage of the process and develop confidence in identifying risks, recognising concerning behaviours and ensuring robust pre-employment checks.</p>		
<b>Course objectives:</b> By the end of the programme attendees will have and understanding of:		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• How to apply safer recruitment principles to their setting</li><li>• Apply robust pre-employment checks for those working with children</li><li>• Develop confidence in identifying risk and recognising concerning behaviours</li><li>• Understand the appropriate referral and reporting routes</li></ul>

## Face to face: Parental substance misuse and the impact on children

**Course Description:** This one-day course will develop and extend your ability to recognise and respond effectively in families where parental substance misuse is having an adverse impact on children.

### Course Objectives:

By the end of the course you will have:

- Been introduced to a framework for making sense of the main actions of drugs that are commonly misused
- Clarified what constitutes 'drug dependence', and some of the reasons why a person might use drugs in a dependent and/or problematic way
- Explored some of the main effects parental substance misuse can have on children at different ages and developmental stages
- Considered a range of case scenarios to identify concerning information and unknown factors, and linked this to a framework for assessing children's needs in substance misusing families.

**Target Audience:** This event is suitable for professionals in all Working Together Groups and meets the requirements of Level 3 of the Intercollegiate Document.

## Face to face: Parental mental health and the impact to children

**Course description:** This one-day course will develop and extend your ability to recognise and respond effectively in families where adult mental illness is having a negative impact on children.

**Course objectives:** By the end of the course you will have:

- Developed your understanding of the definitions and prevalence of mental illness in adults.
- Identified how parental mental ill-health can have an impact on children across a range of ages.
- Explored the specific impacts of depression and personality disorder on adults, their parenting, and professional behaviour.
- Considered learning from recent child safeguarding practice reviews (previously known as serious case reviews) where parental mental illness has been a feature.
- Used a detailed case example to develop your understanding of how to contribute to more effective assessments and interventions.

**Target Audience:** This event is suitable for professionals in all Working Together Groups.

If delegates cannot attend, the Partnership or training providers need to be notified 7 days in advance in order for the place to be filled by another professional.*

### **Where can I find information about the multi-agency training programme?**

### **How do I apply to attend courses?**

Once you have opened a training account you need to visit the website <https://cscp.org.uk/training/calendar-of-events/> and click on the course of your choice, you can then click 'Apply'. You will then receive an email if your application is successful.

You cannot apply for a place on a course unless you have registered with us first. You cannot apply for a place on a course on behalf of somebody else.

### **How much does the training cost and what are the cancellation arrangements?**

CSCP multi-agency courses are funded by the agencies which make up the Partnership. There is no charge for individuals attending CSCP training. Please note that if you are offered a place on a course and do not explain non-attendance or you cancel less than one week before the event your agency will be charged a £125 non-attendance fee. We expect that you will have discussed your application and how it meets your training needs before applying and that your manager will facilitate your attendance. If you need to cancel your place – you must do this via the website.

### **If I can't come can I give my place to someone else from my agency?**

It may be possible to arrange this, but please ask us before proceeding as in some circumstances we will need to offer to those on the waiting list.

### **Will delegates receive certificates on multi-agency courses?**

Participants will be provided with certificates of attendance if they attend the whole course. Arriving late or leaving early may result in not receiving a certificate. All certificates will be shared within 6-8 weeks of the course.
