Course description: Participants will learn about adolescent development and the signs and symptoms of mental health problems, where and how to get help and what sort of help has been shown by research to be effective.

- **Course objectives:** An overview of the latest research on the extent of self-harm among young people and the particular groups at highest risk
- An understanding of why young people self-harm and key steps to help young people reduce their harming
- An understanding of physical and emotional indicators of self-harm and suicide
- Learn clear and practical information on how to explore suicide and respond appropriately.
- Insight into the realities for the first generation of teenagers using technology as a primary means of socialising and communicating.
- Show how to lead constructive self-talk.
- Where to refer young people to specialist support and an introduction to the resources that are available.

Course description: This training will introduce participants to the work of the Exploitation & Missing Team and Youth Violence & Exploitation Team in Camden's Integrated Youth Service.

Course objectives: By the end of the course participants will:

- Identifying risk of child exploitation and its impact on children and their families
- Understanding the exploitative mechanism and how children may experience this, including barriers to disclosure and barriers to engagement
- Camden's borough profile and the issues impacting on children. Including an understanding of locations and emerging themes and trends
- Challenging unconscious bias and adultification
- Using contextual safeguarding to strengthen safety within our communities
- Our approach to transitional safeguarding, supporting vulnerable young adults
- Our tactical response to disrupting exploitation through a contextual safeguarding lens, including through our Multiagency Child Exploitation (MACE) panel
- The Modern Slavery Act and our duty to identify victims of Modern Slavery through the National Referral Mechanism (NRM).
- Understanding the local contexts of youth violence in Camden
- Partnership response to incidents of youth violence
- Community based support to prevent children being impacted by youth violence

<p>Course description: This training explains Prevent (the Government's counter-terrorism strategy), the radicalisation process, how to identify people who may be at-risk of radicalisation, how to raise concerns and appropriate safeguarding responses.</p> <p>WRAP training is aimed at increasing your understanding, knowledge, and awareness in issues relating to radicalisation and extremism while helping professionals counter extremist narratives.</p> <p>Course objectives: Participants will gain:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• An understanding of understand what radicalisation means and why people may be vulnerable to being drawn into terrorism as a consequence of it.• An awareness of what we mean by the term “extremism” and the relationship between extremism and terrorism• The ability to use existing expertise and professional judgment to recognise potential vulnerable individuals and know when an intervention may be necessary to support them• Knowledge of how to obtain support for people who may be being exploited by radicalising influences <p>Target Audience: Anyone working with individuals that are vulnerable to radicalisation including: Youth workers, Social workers, Teachers, Early Years. This event is suitable for professionals in all Working Together Groups.</p>

*The Camden Safeguarding Children Partnership provides safeguarding training **free of charge** to all agencies working directly with children and young people in Camden. The Partnership expects that all delegates offered a place at the course attend. If delegates cannot attend, the Partnership or training providers need to be notified 7 days in advance in order for the place to be filled by another professional.*

Failure to attend the training may result in a £125 non-attendance fee being charged to your agency.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Where can I find information about the multi-agency training programme?

If you have registered a training account with us, you will receive regular emails about courses. You can also visit our website: <https://cscp.org.uk/training/> where course details are posted as soon as they are available.

How do I apply to attend courses?

Once you have opened a training account you need to visit the website <https://cscp.org.uk/training/calendar-of-events/> and click on the course of your choice, you can then click 'Apply'. You will then receive an email if your application is successful.

You cannot apply for a place on a course unless you have registered with us first. You cannot apply for a place on a course on behalf of somebody else.

How much does the training cost and what are the cancellation arrangements?

CSCP multi-agency courses are funded by the agencies which make up the Partnership. There is no charge for individuals attending CSCP training. Please note that if you are offered a place on a course and do not explain non-attendance or you cancel less than one week before the event your agency will be charged a £125 non-attendance fee. We expect that you will have discussed your application and how it meets your training needs before applying and that your manager will facilitate your attendance. If you need to cancel your place – you must do this via the website.

If I can't come can I give my place to someone else from my agency?

It may be possible to arrange this, but please ask us before proceeding as in some circumstances we will need to offer to those on the waiting list.

Will delegates receive certificates on multi-agency courses?

Participants will be provided with certificates of attendance if they attend the whole course. Arriving late or leaving early may result in not receiving a certificate. All certificates will be shared within 6-8 weeks of the course.
